Lisa M. Courtney is the Statewide Alternative Dispute Resolution (ADR) Coordinator for the NYS Unified Court System, where she works to promote the growth of ADR programs throughout New York State. Lisa oversees the statewide ADR office, assists courts in developing ADR programs, teaches mediation workshops for judges, court attorneys, legal services attorneys and private practitioners, and coaches attorneys and law students in bar-sponsored training programs. Lisa is co-chair of the New York Women's Bar Association's ADR Committee, a former volunteer Special Education mediator with the New York Peace Institute, and a former mediator with the Center for Creative Conflict Resolution, a unit of the NYC Office of Administrative Trials and Hearings.

Lisa previously worked in the ADR office of the NYS Office of Court Administration as Special Projects Counsel, where she set up the nation's first Collaborative Family Law Center, and mediated court-referred cases. Before joining OCA, Lisa worked for (Ret.) Justice Fern Fisher, coordinating the New York City Civil Court's Mediation Program, the New York City Housing Court's Volunteer Lawyers Project, the Community Seminar Series, and the Civil Court's Help Centers. She worked previously as a Court Attorney in the Housing Part of the Civil Court of the City of New York, as a legal writing instructor at Brooklyn Law School, and as a litigation associate at Kramer Levin Naftalis and Frankel, LLP. Lisa received her J.D. from the Columbia University School of Law, where she was a Harlan Fiske Stone Scholar, and graduated *cum laude* from Columbia College.
